- *Reaching the unreached people groups.*

 - *Partnerships and cooperation in the Lord's harvest fields.*

W 4 – Finishable Task – Reaching Minorities in East Asia.

Simon Wan, William & Esther Tan, serving in Wycliffe, will share their experiences on reaching minorities in a country in East Asia, specifically working through partnerships for sustainable work with the long haul in view.

W 5 – Reaching the Miao through BAM

Franki Kum, serving with Pioneers International, will share on reaching the Miao people through animal farming in the interiors of Hunan, using the BAM approach.

W 6 – Reaching the Majority in Bangladesh

Dr Jason & Joy David of Antioch Network Community, who work among the poor in Bangladesh, will share on reaching the majority people. They work closely with a team of locals and rejoice in seeing house churches planted.

W 7 – Reaching and discipling Orang Aslis in Malaysia

This is a story of partnership where Malaysian assemblies are actively engaged in reaching and discipling Orang Aslis. Singapore assemblies have come alongside to encourage and minister. The church among OAs is growing. Issues relating to discipleship and leadership equipping as well as challenges and opportunities for ministry will be discussed.

W 8 – Reaching and discipling an ethnic people group in Philippines

A church has been planted among an ethnic people group. There is on-going discipleship work. Issues relating to contextualization and challenges faced will be discussed. This is also a wonderful story of partnership with a Singapore assembly, Bethesda Katong, over the past decade.

W 9 – Communicating spiritual truths through Creative Arts

This workshop will address the need to encourage and equip the Church to reach the emerging generation with the good news through creative arts.

18. For those who sign up for Package B, please indicate the practicum of your choice from P1 to P3. Due to limited vacancies, allocations will be made on a first-come-first-served basis. Note: All Package B conferees will be required to attend the relevant preparatory workshops related to their practicum during Workshop sessions.

P 1 – Interfaith Peace Camp

Participants will have opportunity to stay with Muslims in dormitories, share meals together, and interact on what their respective Scriptures teach on peace. Participants will get to hear and learn more about each other's faith, as they share why they believe what they believe in. This practicum is open only to those 30 years and below. Only 30 places are available.

P 2 – Village Homestay

Participants will stay in a village in the outskirts of Yogyakarta. Hosted by locals, mostly Muslims, they will share meals and have opportunity to discuss day-to-day issues with them. There will be options to join in rice-planting, batik painting and various cultural activities. The experience will provide a glimpse of Indonesian village life. This practicum is open to people of all age groups. 50 places are available.

P 3 – Befriending Through Sports

Sports is a common language that crosses barriers. A "non-contact sport", open to both males and females, will be chosen. Participants will be formed into teams for friendly games. There will be wonderful opportunities for interaction with local students during training sessions and the actual competition. It is designed to be friendly and fun. No age limitation, but participants must be physically healthy to enjoy the sport. 50 places are available.

Kindly note that while the organizers will work toward assigning you the workshops as chosen, you may be assigned alternative workshops in the event that anyone is fully subscribed. Some workshops are also in the process of finalization, and adjustments may be needed closer to the Conference date.
